

The scope of this project covers only the coastal area as shown by the blue dotted line. However, good planning practice always considers the surrounding area as part of the analysis to ensure that the plan of the area continues to be relevant in the long term.

Considering Freshwater coastal area is located only approximately 500m away from its local centre and 2km away from the nearest beach Queenscliff, connections to the surrounding network are very important to establish activities and maintain accessibility within this public space. In order to create a continuous link for the coastal areas, the discussion within the scoping stage may extend beyond the blue dotted line.



Things to consider in this area:

- The beach is enclosed by steep slope at southern end with no direct pedestrian link between private lands to Freshwater View Reserve (1)
- Pedestrian link from Freshwater Beach to Queenscliff area is not straight forward and partially ends on-street (2,3,4,5,6,7)
- Limited signage indicating direction to Freshwater View Reserve (3,7,9)
- A valuable public asset, Freshwater View Reserve has great views over Freshwater coastal areas, but it is hidden between private residences (9,10)

Freshwater View Reserve is a special place. What do you think about these ideas?

- Consider better signage and landscape treatments for pedestrian link to Queenscliff area
- Consider landscape and/or paving treatments as well as better signage to maintain continuity of pedestrians experience
- Install better signage and/or mapping to indicate direction to Freshwater View Reserve
- Consider creating a track and/or entry sequence to the Reserve

Things to consider in this area:


- View from Moore Road and to the beach obstructed by gazebo and children playground. This playground is also adjacent to a low key pedestrian entry to the reserve (1,2,3)
- Surf Lifesaving Club Cafe opens to the park area, however a large portion of the building wall is facing the park. Cafe seating is currently adjacent to a garage entry and driveway access, and is separated from a central children playground. This driveway cuts through the pedestrian link and separates the park from the beach area (4,5,6)
- Central open space is mainly on a slope with more activities occurring on a flatter land. View to the beach is restricted (7,8,9)
- A large part of the reserve is dedicated for at-grade open car parking. Access to this and occasional parking off Kooloora Avenue is separating the central park to the rest of the reserve (10,11,12)

Freshwater beach area is known for its beauty. What do you think about these ideas?

- Opening up area at the end of Moore Park to create a better arrival experience and view to Freshwater Beach
- Allocate more opening to west of the building to address the park and improve cafe seating location. Co-locating children playground with complementary activities may improve safety
- Improve opportunity for views and design change of level to accommodate various activity areas and special events
- Create improved pedestrians experience at Kooloora Avenue and explore opportunities for landscape treatments to reduce glare from open parking

Things to consider in this area:

- Pedestrian path ends at various points with no clear path linking Freshwater beach and the pool. Very limited directional signage in this area (1,2,3,4,5,6)
- Swim club building with view to Freshwater has limited use during the week (7,12)
- Access to swimming pool can be improved to cater all users. The ramp to the pool does not comply with the accessibility code (8,9)
- The highest point with overview to Freshwater does not attract people to use the space and very limited directional signage to direct pedestrian access to these areas (10, 11, 12)

Coastal walk followed by a swim is one way to experience this space. What do you think about these ideas?

- Creating better accessibility and clearer route for pedestrians from the beach to connect to the existing pedestrian link. Seamless recreational link along the coastal area will encourage more activities along this route
- Explore some improvements to swim club building uses and the surrounding public domain
- Improve amenity and experience for pool visitors including for accessibility
- Explore potential for better viewing platform on the headland. Consider installation of directional signage to provide clearer direction to the surrounding area as part of integrated pedestrian network
