Area 1 - Freshwater View - comments from community drop in sessions March 2017

What do you love about this space?

- Secluded hidden gem

What can we do to make this space better?

- Nothing
- Planting of low maintenance native plants to replace and out-compete weeds
- Attention to road run-off to reduce nutrients from stormwater
- Shade trees where possible
- A level off-road grassed area between Crown Road and Pavilion Street (end) to avoid road
- Maintenance issues with bush regeneration
- Observation point (path to go down from park) towards the beach
- The tunnel (walkway to link to Manly) John Lewis 1880ish
- Fence around
- Link to connect Curl Curl to Freshwater (disabled)
- Connection in walking (continues)
- Walkway around the headlands eg, Cinque Terre, Italy

- Fencing above cliff to improve safety
- Bike connection to Manly
- The step rails don't work as they keep changing sides
- Off-road pedestrian access (between Crown and Pavilion East)
- Wayfinding Freshwater to Manly, Freshwater to Curl Curl
- Better management of stormwater in south corner, particularly the open drain
- Weddings in the reserve occupy the whole reserve, so another viewing platform under the park would be good - public can't use it when wedding is there
- No litter bins (so they leave mess and local has to pick up)
- Stormwater issue overgrowth on for just this area. Fences are run down.
- Clear weeds... plant natives
- Don't change anything. Just keep tidy and trim / remove tall trees to allow visitors to 'take in' the view
- Plant a native garden or scented garden to make it a destination for reflection. Put a
 decent fence up to prevent people sitting on the cliff and falling off!
- Improve view (cutting larger bushes / maintaining) native plants, bush regeneration
- Managing the lower part of the garden to show the terraces and keep vegetation low enough to enjoy the amazing view - No Dogs!!
- The bush area could be rejuvenated and have more native plants. Fix the fence on the end of Undercliff Street
- Bush Regeneration work
- Get rid of lantana
- Fix log fencing / ? Viewing point / platform at end of Undercliff for Undercliff Reserve)
- More recycling bins
- Control weeds below Freshwater View Reserve and by the steps/path to Pilu Restaurant ie, Plan of Management
- More trees and tree care also on Bridge Street steps

Area 2 - Freshwater Beach - comments from community drop in sessions - March 2017

What can we do to make this space better?

- The small playground doesn't get used very often
- Better undercover BBQ
- Fence around playground (safety issue)
- Smaller playground can be moved to improve views
- Improve turning circle at Moore Road for truck (drive on grass)
- Asphalt the overflow car park use all the time
- Don't park over grass
- Mound prevent connection
- Plant shade trees, particularly on hill
- More challenging playground varied age group
- Landscaped areas shrubs more interesting mix of trees
- Retain grassed areas / overflow car parks and exclude cars when not required eg, next to Surf Club, with gate / bollards
- Nothing
- Green space next to car park in corner could be used for overflow parking, but it gets flooded and boggy
- Some low landscape, keep green but less dense so it's safer for all
- Toilet sign on boatshed to save angst
- Please leave overflow carpark grassed soft area used by all every day, dog exercising, kids sport, learning to ride bikes

- Accessible path to Pilu kiosk
- Not enough lighting
- Rough landscaping
- Accessibility issue (path is not continuous)
- Seating in the clearing area (views)
- Better lighting
- Another cabana outside Pilu near the other one
- Clean weeds and bush between Surf Club and swings
- Open up the grassed area south of Surf Club it's public land
- Toilet signage improvements
- Leave trees, remove fence and lantana, and make into amphitheatre (area near Moore Road carpark)
- Fitness equipment
- Drinking bubbler near Surf Club (eastern side)
- More gazebos
- Proper fitness equipment
- Better toilet facilities in the park (like Dee Why)
- A spot to view the ocean would be good
- Need the sand dunes cleared like old times
- Do something to stop drug and alcohol parties in sand dunes
- Need to resolve issues of bad behaviour in sand dunes
- Update park facilities and fence off from road for better safety for children
- More / better cabanas, undercover cooking area with accessible facilities
- Delineate the carpark entrance at Kooloora Avenue
- Fence around the Kooloora Avenue Park
- More shade
- Facilities for teens eg, basketball
- Fitness equipment to discourage the use of picnic tables etc and manage noise in the early mornings
- Both playgrounds need upgrading to provide more equipment
- Kooloora Ave new playground upgrade with fence
- Upgrade playgrounds with safety fencing, equipment to be more challenging, replace softfall
- Protected bike path, safe for kids
- Kooloora Ave playground fence and shade cloth
- Consider a court or a half-court
- Overflow carpark needs natural grass, no hard surface
- Addressing drainage and ponding issues in overflow carpark
- Better traffic management in carparks
- Overflow carpark keep grassed area
- Wayfinding from steps (from Curl Curl)
- Exercise equipment
- Connect path to pool and across carpark
- Shade sail and a scooter track around the edge of the park
- More green, less concrete, no more tall trees, path to Freshwater View Reserve
- Consider moving the playground away from the corner (Kooloora Ave). Redesign the area to be more functional
- Public toilets, separate amenities
- Café to address park
- Leave it alone!! No more asphalt. Regrass. Keep the children's play areas. No more commercial development

- Define the areas a bit better, have some more seating under trees for summer and UPDATE the play equipment! They must be at least 20 years old with no imagination. Swing and slide is very poor.
- Add outdoor stage with lights and power for community events at lower end to act like amphitheatre
- no change
- add 2 more BBQ areas at Moore Road end
- Revegetate with dense scrub (low) to allow view, keep kids out and trap sand
- Boardwalk. Reshape current north entry and place new vegetated dune from halfway up to Ocean View Road
- More garbage collection points
- Make it dog friendly. Off-leash allowed 8pm-8am so locals can exercise the dog
 without fear of being booked. Most of us are responsible dog walkers and pick up, so
 can't see the harm. Got an old dog who can't walk all the way to Curl Curl so need
 overflow carpark to be officially dog friendly. Please!
- · More benches with view of beach / water
- Regular care of the palm trees otherwise leave as it is.
- Danger of falling palms
- Lighting
- Paths
- Improve playground
- Water bubbler
- Bike racks
- Another gazebo more seating
- More shade, better lighting, improve/upgrade kids play equipment
- Bike rack (just at end of car park)
- Water bubbler
- Bubbler/water fountain by both playgrounds
- Shade structure over playgrounds behind SLSC (do NOT fence the playgrounds)
- Steps from Freshwater View leading to the beach like Curl Curl
- Suggest build a terrace here
- Dog off leash areas need to be separate from main walking routes
- Dog off leash area
- NO dog off leash area on Freshwater Beach
- Clear and landscape and terrace path areas up to Queenscliff
- Sandstone seats in amphitheatre style to provide views to beach. Not enough seating currently
- Plant out the sand dunes with natives, get rid of lantana and other toxic plants and weeds
- More picnic cabanas and better landscape
- Bike racks
- Improve the quality of grass is a dirt bowl now
- Better path access from street down to Pilu
- More benches at end of Moore Road
- Shade trees along the back area of grass
- More trees
- Setting and terrace to hill. Maybe relocate play equipment
- Sprinkler system to disperse teenagers at night
- · Picnic tables more and scattered
- Open grassy space works very well now but palm trees need regular attention due to dropping palms (especially near playground)
- Playground upgrade

- More picnic huts
- Community Garden
- Safe bike path to beach
- Fenced playground gated safety issue for kids
- Second entrance to overflow carpark
- A walking path continued behind carpark / beach so you don't have to walk in carpark
- Better toilet facility separate for Surf Club

- Wider accesses to beach
- Don't get rid of vegetation on sand dunes please
- Boardwalk end of Ocean View Road to join footpath at Northern end of beach.
 Reshape access (motor and walking) to go behind first dune and out to boatshed
- Walkway bridge over stormwater pipes and wet corner
- Public access pathway down side of block

- Wayfind at Carrington and Lumsdaine

- Landscaping is unimaginative. More excitement, exotic plants

- Duke Statue not seen to the best advantage feature of Freshwater could it be moved?
- Carpark needs better landscaping
- Bulldoze the Diggers
- Additional seats overlooking beach on south side of headland carpark?
- Protect natural areas particularly rocks on beach and cliff areas already well used for recreation
- Avoid diverting too much additional pedestrian traffic along existing path which is
 well used and a scenic walkway with native vegetation and rock outcrops either side
 existing width is satisfactory / good for walkers
- Reduce plant height from McKillop Park (above pool) so you get better view
- Paint recessive colour (dark green) on swim club (North Head Sewerage Plant)
- Leave it alone!
- The Clubhouse above the pool seems under-utilised
 - Upgrade existing building above pool for meeting room, kitchen and decent change rooms, showers and toilets
 - Provide smooth path around headland and gradual ramp up on northside to meet main walkway from Curl Curl
- Leashed dogs should be allowed to walk to the pool so they can sit and watch us do a few laps and continue round the rock ledge
- Improve access to McKillop viewpoint from carpark
- Manage the bushland well. Improve access from good end to footpath with careful design by landscape architects
- Pathway past rockpool could be connected to street / carpark
- Better connection between Freshwater Pool and Ocean View Road
- Keep as is but also connect path from rock pool to Ocean View Road

General comments on this space

- At Northern end of beach have map with alternate walking route via Ocean View Road up Soldiers Avenue (Historic Avenue of Honour) returning via Oliver Street, Lawrence Street, Moore Road and rejoin coastal walk at southern end of Freshie Beach. Reverse directions at this end.
