The main issues include:</li> <li>Pedestrian and Bike Path – Avalon Beach Town Centre</li> <li>Intersection</li> <li>Sydney Buses - Bus Stop Interchange (Old Barrenjoey Road) and Bus Stop on Barrenjoey Road</li> <li>Gateway Entrance</li> <li>Changes/updates to the Plan.</li> </ul>		

F	An Alternative Pedestrian Bike Path endorsed by APA, CAPBRA and PBWBA, was submitted to Council on 6 October 2020 and distributed to ACRG Members on the same day.
C	Discussion Following Presentation
L	oss of Car Parking Spaces
	The loss of parking spaces as a consequence of footpath widening and to a lesser extent the shared zone, was discussed by the ACRG.
F k t L	Council Response: Potential for 14 parking spaces to be lost, however 8 of these would be lost irrespective of the changes due to the required upgrade of the existing non-compliant pedestrian crossings that are required to undertaken to comply with the relevant Australian standards (Phil Devon confirmed that once Council is aware of a hazard it is under duty of care to amend and remove the hazard)
<u> </u>	_oss of Trees
	Another major concern raised was the number of trees that would be removed to accommodate the design proposals.
r a	Staff confirmed that 6 trees have been identified for removal in relation to the proposal for Old Barrenjoey Road (south) and approximately 5-6 shrubs on the corner of Avalon Parade and Barrenjoey Road intersection, due to the Beach Gateway design.
	Council ensures every attempt will be made to protect and preserve mature trees during streetscape improvement works.

i c v	The perceived safety of the Old Barrenjoey Road and Avalon Parade ntersection was discussed with some members of the ACRG questioning the trial of the one-way shared zone and the cost for the works. Other options such as decreased speed zones throughout the Avalon Beach Town Centre was discussed.

	Some member of the ACRG voiced their concerns on the timeline and costings.
F ii	Council Response: The ACRG were reminded that the costs outlined in the draft Place Plan are indicative and priorities allocated to actions have been done n line with the Place Score data. Place Score data established what the community cared about and identified priorities for actions.

	No decision made at this point. Transport for NSW progressing through preferred provider process.

Relocation of the Bus Stop on Barrenjoey Road
Some ACRG Members have suggested that the Bus Stop on Barrenjoey Road (Beach Gateway) should be relocated north of its current location:
Council Response: Relocation of the bus stop to the north of the current site is not supported by Transport for NSW.
Forward Path
Andrew Pigott reminded the ACRG Members that the draft Avalon Beach Place Plan is still a draft document and has not yet been placed on broader public exhibition. The public exhibition process will allow the broader Avalon Beach community to review the document and provide comments.
Ray Brownlee confirmed that the draft Avalon Beach Place Plan should proceed to Council for endorsement to allow it to be placed on public exhibition and gauge the opinion of the broader Avalon Beach community.
The following points were supported:
• That the Alternative Pedestrian Bike Path submission endorsed by APA, CABPRA and PBWBA be placed on public exhibition with the draft Avalon Beach Place Plan.
<ul> <li>The draft Place Plan will <u>not</u> be placed on public exhibition over the Christmas holiday period.</li> </ul>
• Avalon Beach residents will be sent a letter informing them of the exhibition of the draft Avalon Beach Place Plan.
<ul> <li>Hard copies of the Avalon Beach Place Plan will be made available for the community to view at Avalon Beach Customer Service Centre or Avalon Beach Library.</li> </ul>
• Full details of the bike paths are included in the draft Place Plan prior to going to Council.
• ACRG Members are to be notified of any changes to the draft Place Plan prior to the Place Plan going to Council.
<ul> <li>Paving and lighting is moved up the list of priorities and budget identified in the 2022/2023 Delivery Plan.</li> </ul>
Ray Brownlee and Andrew Pigott, thanked the Avalon CRG Members for their hard work over the last 3 years in developing the draft Avalon Beach Place Plan with Council Staff.
