1. Summary¹

This report outlines the first stage of community and stakeholder engagement conducted as part of the Ivanhoe Park (including Manly Oval) Masterplan and Plan of Management project.

Council undertook a robust and wide-ranging initial consultation process focusing on individual and group values/perceptions, concerns, aspirations and desires for Ivanhoe Park as well as specific requirements for existing users, to consider and inform the planning phase of this project.

Formal community engagement feedback was gathered via an online survey on Yoursay from 7 December 2020 to 17 January 2021.

Stakeholder engagement included a workshop and second meeting with the Design Reference Group (made up of representatives of stakeholder groups and community members) on 27 November 2020 and 17 March 2021, as well as targeted interviews and site inspections withkey stakeholders of the site from November to January 2021.

Analysis of the survey and stakeholder feedback has helped to reaffirm what is special about the park and why it needs to be preserved. Reponses identified a number of key issues including lack of connectivity, park identity, accessibility, pedestrian safety, passive surveillance and maintenance. A high number of respondents raised concerns about better safety and security at night. They also expressed improvements were needed to existing facilities to make them better fit for purpose, cater for current and future generations of park users and multi-use.

This feedback has been considered and informed the preparation of the planning documents for this project. The design of any improvements or proposed works should be in keeping with heritage principles and not impact on those special values of the park expressed by the community.



2. Background

Ivanhoe Park is formed by two parts, the upper western passive recreation area known as 'Ivanhoe Park Botanic Gardens', and the lower sporting precinct incorporating Manly Oval, Bowling Club and Tennis Club facilities.

The Botanic Gardens and Manly Oval areas are under the care and responsibility of NBC. The Bowling Club/Mounties and Manly Tennis Club lots have special leases directly with Crown Lands.

The site's unique landscape setting and recreational amenity have played an important role in the historical development of Manly from Aboriginal times through to present day as a place for everyone to enjoy.

On 23 August 2019, Ivanhoe Park (including Manly Oval) was listed on the State Heritage Register for its cultural landscape heritage. Following the State Heritage listing, Council resolved to prepare a Conservation Management Plan, a revised Plan of Management and accompanying Landscape Masterplan.

To assist with this comprehensive and complex planning process, Council engaged a team of specialist consultants to work collaboratively with council staff and internal stakeholders on developing the documentation for the project - GML Heritage to prepare the CMP, NBRS to prepare the landscape masterplan and architectural concepts, and Parkland Planners to prepare the Plan of Management.

3. Engagement objectives

Our community engagement objectives were to:

- build community and stakeholder awareness of participation activities (inform)
- provide accessible information so community and stakeholders can participate in a meaningful way (inform)
- identify community and stakeholder concerns, local knowledge and values (consult).

4. Engagement approach

Stage one community and stakeholder engagement for the Ivanhoe Park (including Manly Oval) Masterplan and Plan of Management project was conducted over a 6-week period, from 7 December 2020 to 17 January 2021.

The engagement was planned, implemented and reported in accordance with Council's <u>Community Engagement Matrix</u> (2017). The full documented engagement approach is outlined in the Ivanhoe Park (including Manly Oval) Masterplan and Plan of Management Community and Stakeholder Engagement Plan (November 2020).

The engagement was designed as a two-stage approach aimed to better understand the existing relationship people and groups have with Ivanhoe Park, including how they use it, what they like about it and suggestions for improvements.

Engagement included the establishment of a Design Reference Group of representatives of stakeholder groups and community members to assist us throughout the various phases of the project including discussing a shared vision for the park and reviewingdraft documents.



We also held meetings and site inspections of key facilities with key external and internal stakeholder groups to understand their specific issues, requirements and aspirations.

A project webpage³ was established on our have your say platform with information provided in an accessible and easy to read format. The project page included background information, a map of the study area and links to the relevant Council report and webpages. The project was promoted via onsite signage, resident and stakeholder notifications, our Council E-News and our community engagement newsletter.

Feedback was captured through an online survey linked from the project webpage.

Stage two will be the public exhibition of the draft Masterplan and Plan of Management to ensure these are supported by a broad cross-section of the community.

4.1. Engaging with hard to reach communities

In addition to the above, we worked with our youth and community development teams (liaisons to our young people, multicultural communities and not-for-profit organisations/community services) and utilised their platforms and networks in an attempt to reach a diverse audience.

We promoted the project via the KALOF Facebook page and sent an email to members of Council's exiting and previous Youth Advisory Groups. We also liaised with Council's Community Development team to better understand homelessness, anti-social elements occurring in the park, and inclusion and accessibility needs.

5. Summary of findings

319 people completed the survey which included a diverse representation of ages, suburbs and users of the park.

93 percent of survey respondents use Ivanhoe Park and 77 percent walk to the park. The most frequent reason for not using the park was a lack of awareness of the park/botanic gardens.

75 percent of respondents visit multiple times a week or a few times a month, while weekday and weekend mornings and afternoons are the most popular times to visit. Most common uses of the park include walking through, sitting/relaxing and fitness/exercise.

Deemed an "oasis" by one respondent, the peaceful nature of the park and its contrast to the busy Manly urban and beach areas came up most often as the 'most liked or special' aspect of the park. The park is also most valued for its vegetation, sporting facilities, heritage, open space and multiple passive and active recreation uses.

There was a common view that the park was used as a thoroughfare more than a destination, when there was no formal sport on. When asked to suggest improvements, there was strong support for the park to be more accessible, inviting and inclusive and could better provide for families with improved play, seating and picnic facilities.

Many respondents felt the park should remain as is or recommended only minimal changes. Where there were specific improvements requested, there was strong demand for better

safety and security at night, upgrade and/or improved aesthetics of the Scout hall, improved spectator facilities at Manly Oval, better physical and visual connectivity to Manly Town Centre and adjoining open spaces, improved internal access and paths.

Survey responses suggest that many people were not aware that Ivanhoe Park included Manly Oval, a botanic garden or that the whole of the park is historic.

6. Council's response to the findings

Analysis of the survey and stakeholder feedback has helped to reaffirm what is special about the park and why it needs to be preserved.

This feedback including the findings and policies outlined in the CMP have been taken into consideration and helped guide the development of the planning documents for this project. The design of any improvements or proposed works should be in keeping with heritage principles and not impact on those special values of the park expressed by the community.

Council are proposing a range of park improvements in the masterplan and plan of management actions to:

- help reconnect the park to Manly Town Centre / Wharf and adjoining open spaces; enhance the park's overall appearance and presentation to be more inviting
- better connect the sporting and garden precincts
- create safer, more accessible spaces and facilities to provide for all users
- provide fit for purpose facilities that will better cater for current and future generations of users, activities and events.

Suggested recommendations also consider better connectivity and access between the park and the Manly Bowling Club and Tennis Club facilities.

Moving into the next phase of the project we will consider improvements to:

- park entries, streetscape, pathways, boundary fences and signage
- existing park plantings along boundaries and in garden areas to improve views and passive surveillance in the park
- material/finishes and colour palette of built and park elements to provide more consistency and unify park spaces
- lighting
- public amenities.

Other considerations will include the creation of central lawn amphitheatre space and finding ways to better showcase historical elements of the park.

We will also examine the viability of a new grandstand and sports pavilion building facilities that better integrate and complement the significant cultural landscape setting and cater for current and future generations.

1 IVANHOE PARK ONLINE SURVEY

1.1 Introduction

The online survey was open from Monday 7 December to Sunday 17 January 2021 on Your Say Northern Beaches https://yoursay.northernbeaches.nsw.gov.au/ivanhoe-park

317 online responses were received.

Two additional written responses were received outside Your Say, which are also included below.

1.2 Characteristics of survey respondents

Key characteristics of the online survey respondents are:

- 46% are 40 to 60 years old
- 55% are female
- 96% do not identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander
- 95% do not identify as having disability
- ☐ 72% live in a household comprising a couple or couple with children
- 81% live in Manly, Manly East, Fairlight
- 40% belong to Mounties/Manly Bowling Club.

1.3 Use of Ivanhoe Park

Survey respondents' use of Ivanhoe Park:

- 93% use Ivanhoe Park. The most frequent reason for not using the park was a lack of awareness of the park/botanic gardens
- □ 77% walk to Ivanhoe Park
- ☐ 75% visit multiple times a week/a few times a month
- Weekday and weekend mornings and afternoons are the most popular times to visit
- Walking through (17%), sitting/relaxing (15%) and fitness/exercise (12%) are the most popular activities.

- The siting of the grandstand is wrong.
 It needs to be parallel to a major axis of the football field.

Don't over develop the park, it isn't large and is already crowded

Re-designing the stands overlooking the oval using natural shading where possible

I think the grandstand seating and stairways/steps need improvements ie. with some steps/stairs not to code with some deeper than others making it tricky to navigate.

It needs to cleaned more regularly, especially at the top flat section where the harmless and homeless people gather.

The grandstand is always full of broken glass and is dated.

Install additional seating on the western side of the Oval up to the bowling green wall. There is currently a row of 3 benches for about 20 metres. This could be increased to 4 rows with a roof cover and be extended for another 25 metres.

Return of seating next to the oval and scaffold seating between the oval and the bowling club. The later area has turned into a car park or an area for storing rubbish bins.

I have complained of vandalism in the park previously with little response by either NBC or Manly Police. More security is required particularly if more money is to be spent on the park. Is CCTV an option. Its very frustrating because Manly Police station is only 300m away.

Don't really want to encourage people into the park at night though.

It would be great to see a bit of police presence especially at night. There are some youth who are making it uncomfortable and it feels unsafe at times.

Make it safer for women at night time

Awful that new plantings are often destroyed for no reason - take measures to prevent that if possible – lighting

Make it a little more "safer" so people feel comfortable to walk through in the evening. Eg lights, better visibility

The park itself could maybe use some more lighting in spots but otherwise nice enough

Make it more "safe" more visible as a woman I don't like walking there alone

Additional automatic lighting for security and for darker overcast days.

Another thing I'd like to see is a proper resolution to the vandal issue - there's little point spending money on new landscaping etc if it's likely to get ripped out - too many times precious and long established plantings have been destroyed.

Potentially better lighting design to offer safety for people but it must be heritage consistent.

I wish there were a stronger police presence at night in the park and the oval to discourage drunken vandals.

It would be great if the lighting was maintained. I am a shift worker and often take my dog there when it is dark and find it a bit unsafe.

Extra patrols of the grand stand to evict the young hoodlums who congregate there would be great. Scout hall does not always feel a safe space to get to for evening kids sports. Needs to be more inviting and perhaps more lighting around it?

I haven't walked through there at night lately (it's a beautiful and convenient walk/short cut) so is it safe and secure enough to do so ie well lit?

However, unfortunately it has become a place for young people to congregate, litter and cause damage at night. It would be worthwhile for the police to patrol through the park at night and possibly better lighting around the scout hall area and along the path

More patrolling by rangers. It feels unsafe after dark. Occasionally I find used syringes and silver cylinders

In relation to the request for greater police presence, perhaps rangers are more appropriate in this instance.

Better night lighting. CCTV security or some way to make it more secure. There are very dark areas at night and teenagers meet and cause trouble in the park late at night. We often come across damage and empty bottles etc. we don't walk in the park at night. Making it a magical place at night would assist. Fairy lights or better lighting. Definitely cameras

a little safer in the evenings - more lighting after dark until maybe 11pm

Better lighting better night patrols

Botanic gardens is a hidden gem but potentially too hidden. Seems a bit dark for people to use the space properly.

The vandalism is an issue and maybe the police and rangers need to patrol the park in the evenings. Make it safer to walk through at night time - better lighting and maybe cameras to stop vandalism Needs after hour security . Complete area should be fenced off , too much damage is occurring . Safer areas where people can comfortably walk through without the fear of walking into somebodies make shift home.

I've walked through the botanic gardens a few times, years ago, as a pleasant alternative to walking down Sydney Rd towards the beach. I used the entrance near corner of Sydney Rd and Park Ave, and noticed a group of day drinkers there near the path. I imagine women especially would be very uncomfortable with this and feel unsafe. If these men still gather there, I suggest encourage them to use a different area in the gardens, well away from pedestrian paths.

Council seems to have some 'fear' of the Rugby club and don't want to 'offend' them. well it offends the public to have the Rugby club's patrons leave their refuse on public land and not dispose of it properly. Council - take action.

The preschool was such an amazing spot with the park in front. So much more community benefit compared to kangaroo street preschool where there is no public space for parents to meet other parents. Strongly suggest you ask the community what they think of your plans for the preschool. It's strange you haven't mentioned it in your letter to residents. Nor is it visible on the map your provided. Feels a bit underhand to be honest.

Please keep the preschool and play area and sensory garden. It's unbelievable that the building has fallen into disrepair when it was such an amazing location for a preschool. It brought families into the heart of an underused beautiful space in manly.

The child centre should be renovated and retained.

Please reconsider what you have done to the preschool. You don't even mention it in your letter to residents, which is very disappointing that you try not to draw attention to it. You also managed to hide both the preschool and the play area on your image. Really outrageous.

Either remove or bring up to standard the old kindergarten in the botanic gardens and these could be used for public hire and/or seniors use.

What these trees did was to define the grassy rise space from the tramline space and so these trees were spatially very important - we need to plant some large trees there, at least one on either side to reinstate that feeling of spatial definition.

Understorey planting should be reinstated in area C the Canopy Garden. People should NOT be encouraged to access / walk in the gulley.

A few years ago the understorey was thinned which I think was a big mistake. This allowed weeds to grow and gave vandals access to vulnerable plantings (eg the now decimated magnificent stand of tree ferns). The planted areas should be denser, not lighter.

The Masterplan indicates that for Area A understory plants will be removed to provide views. I think that understory should be maintained as it provides habitat for small birds which are always welcome in a densely built up area.

Cutting down of any trees for 'open' spaces is not accepted for this day and age. We have too many and making more isn't helpful for people or especially the environment. I'm concerned that our council thinks this is a way for people to use the space.



- I have no idea where it is but more so I'm just not in Manly that often. It's hard to get there from Elanora and if I do I go to the beach not a park


Other reasons for not using the park are:

Figure 2 How do you travel to Ivanhoe Park?






Figure 4 When do you use Ivanhoe Park?

Figure 5 What activities do you do in Ivanhoe Park? (Please select all that apply)







Figure 6 What is your postcode?




13 What is your gender?


14 What is your year of birth?

Figure 8 What is your year of birth?




15 What is your household type?

Figure 9 What is your household type?




16 Are you of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander origin?
