- Survey recap
 - Thank you to all those who responded
 - We asked what you'd like to preserve: heritage (built form and cultural), character, community, culture of Manly, natural environment
 - Concerns: poorly maintained shops, housing affordability, congestion from traffic, anti-social behaviour and limited opportunities for performance space
- This is what we heard from you last session:
 - Movement popularity of cycling, need to improve how other emerging modes (i.e. ride-share, e-wheeling) are catered for, potential for improved secure bicycle parking, concerns about traffic congestion in Manly centre

- Parks and open spaces, social infrastructure, and public domain focus on role and identity of the Corso, desire for intimate performance spaces, activation of Library/Town Hall, improved curation of events
- Heritage and building design need to maintain heritage character, improve coordination of shops/awnings on the Corso
- Economy and night-time economy improved balance of family-friendly nighttime activities, increased intimate performance spaces, digital platforms which improve experience

5. Vision and Principles Workshop

Interactive workshop activity

- A collective vision, principles that will guide us to achieve this vision, and the priority actions
 - Vision = cake
 - Principles = recipe, the how
 - Priority actions = ingredients / shopping list

Draft Vision

- A place plan Vision and its purpose: a shared statement, sets a desirable future state for Manly and guides the decision making process around Manly's future
- Presented a draft Vision for Manly's Place Plan:
 "Sydney's premier seaside destination, embracing a healthy and welcoming day and night economy, iconic natural features and vibrant public spaces."

Discussion questions (Miro Board):

- How do you feel about this draft vision?
 - General consensus that it should be refined to include some more 'Manly-specific' elements
- What do you or don't you like about this statement?
 - o Like: economy works in this context, capture strong points
 - Dislikes: Too generic, seems to be aimed at tourists, not locals; use 'community spaces' over 'public spaces'; order of words should start with locals / businesses, end with tourist-focus.
- What are some key words that summarise Manly as a place for you?
 - Liveability
 - History
 - Friendly quirky character
 - Village feel and local culture
 - Cosmopolitan gateway to the beaches (vs. village feel)
 - o Heritage
 - Indigenous connection and history
 - Unique position between beach, bush, harbour
 - Vibrant groups and economy (day and night)

Draft Principles

Ross H noted that principles give effect to the vision, reflect and enliven it; they also organise and categorise the tangible initiatives. It is important to get a balance of clear and actionable principles.
