1. Summary

This report outlines the outcomes of community and stakeholder engagement as part of a proposal to either renew Aranda Reserve playground or replace with an alternative recreational use between 15 February to 17 March 2024.

The feedback collected during consultation indicated a high level of support to maintain and renew the playground in Aranda Reserve.

Feedback also suggested that many local residents would like to see fitness equipment or open informal recreational space.



2. Background

Council's <u>Open Space and Outdoor Recreation Strategy and Action Plan</u> identified that there were a high number of playgrounds in the vicinity of Aranda Reserve, Frenchs Forest. The plan included an action to consult with the local community to establish if there was a desire for the playground to be renewed or removed and replaced with an alternative recreational use.

3. Engagement objectives

Community and stakeholder engagement aimed to:

- build community and stakeholder awareness of participation activities
- provide accessible information so community and stakeholders can participate in a meaningful way
- identify community and stakeholder concerns, local knowledge and values
- recognise, manage and communicate the needs and interests of community and stakeholders, including decision makers
- seek out and facilitate the involvement of those affected by or interested in a project
- communicate to community and stakeholders how their input was incorporated into the planning and decision making process.

4. Engagement approach

Community and stakeholder engagement for the Aranda Reserve Frenchs Forest -Playground Renewal was conducted between 15 February and 17 March 2024, and consisted of a series of activities that provided opportunities for community and stakeholders to contribute.

The engagement was planned, implemented and reported in accordance with Council's <u>Community Engagement Strategy</u> (2022).

A project page² was established on our have your say platform with information provided in an accessible and easy to read format.

The project was primarily promoted through our regular email newsletter (EDM) channels.

Feedback was captured through an online survey embedded onto the have your say project page. The form included a question that directly asked respondents to nominate their top two preferences from a list of the following options:

- Renew the play equipment with similar equipment, to meet Australian standards renewal will include soft fall
- Remove the play equipment and replace with static fitness equipment, e.g. pull-up bars, sit-up station, etc
- Remove the play equipment and replace with a picnic table and shelter
- Remove the play equipment and landscape the reserve to create open green space for informal recreation

An open-field comments box provided community members a space to explain provide any other feedback they wished to contribute.

Email and written comments were also invited.

5. Findings

The feedback collected during consultation indicated a high level of support to maintain and renew the playground in Aranda Reserve. Many respondents commented that there were local families that valued the playground.

Feedback also suggested that many local residents would like to see fitness equipment or open informal recreational space.

Other comments suggested that there could be more play equipment or that the park could cater for other ages and user groups by incorporating fitness equipment, open space or a community garden.

All respondents were generally supportive of either the playground to be renewed or used for alternative recreation activities.

Theme	Issues, change requests and other considerations raised	Council's response
Young families currently using the playground	Many respondents commented that there were young families in the area who value the playground, and it should therefore be renewed.	The preference to renew the playground is noted.
Play equipment options and style	Some respondents commented that there should be more or better play equipment that catered to a variety of ages.	This is a small playground with limited space. New equipment will hopefully cater for a range of users, however it is difficult to cater for all in such a small playground.
Other uses for the reserve including open space	Some respondents commented that the reserve should include other facilities such as fitness equipment, open space or a community garden.	The playground will only utilise a portion of the reserve, leaving space for informal recreation.

15	Dear Council, Thanks for the opportunity to comment on options for the Aranda Reserve to make it more appropriate for the years to come. Though I have lived in Frenchs Forest for 53 years and in a very near street to Aranda Drive, I have no concept of how the current Reserve, with its aging play equipment, has and is being used. I presume the Council have some data as to the volume of people that use the Reserve over the recent years, and that this info has enabled the various options to be suggested. It's a very complex subject to arrive at a best option, while noting the ever-changing demographics and together with the changing social patterns and the ever-changing activities being offered for all ages.
	However, I commend the Council for seeking the community's opinion on a variety of Council options.
	Therefore, to assist the Council's process towards making a decision, I offer the options 3 and 4, as I've marked above.
	Though I support, in general, the need to slowly increase the density of homes within our community, I strongly reject an 'other' option which is not listed, but may be suggested and that is to replace the Reserve with a dwelling/s. The remaining and existing green spaces must be absolutely kept.
