1. Summary

This report details the outcomes of the community and stakeholder engagement conducted for the proposal to improve the sports amenities facilities at Porter Reserve, Newport. A new building will be constructed to accommodate female change facilities, first aid room, unisex accessible toilet, canteen and covered BBQ area.

The feedback collected during consultation indicated an overwhelming level of support for the proposed new change space at Porter Reserve Clubhouse. The most cited comments were support of improved facilities for women, which would in turn facilitate an increase in the level of female participation in sport. Many respondents commented that the proposed upgrade is much needed and will improve the club facilities.

Feedback also suggested that the opportunity to grow the club would provide a positive benefit to the Northern Beaches sporting community more broadly, and its inclusive and accessible design was supported.

Some respondents also provided feedback on the design proposal related to aspects like the building outlook, accessibility and additional rooms/facilities.







Community and Stakeholder Engagement Report Porter Reserve Clubhouse Newport - new change space



2. Background

This report outlines the community and stakeholder engagement conducted as part of the exhibition period of the project.

Council is planning to improve the sports amenities facilities at Porter Reserve. The new amenities building will provide additional facilities as part of our commitment to support the community's recreational needs and the growth of female participation in sport.

The proposal includes an amenities building with a female change room, accessible toilet, first aid room, canteen and covered BBQ area. The community was asked to view the concept plan and provide their feedback about the proposed improvements to the facilities at Porter Reserve.

3. Engagement objectives

Community and stakeholder engagement for the project aimed to:

- build community and stakeholder awareness of participation activities
- provide accessible information so community and stakeholders can participate in a meaningful way
- identify community and stakeholder concerns, local knowledge and values
- provide balanced and objective information to assist the public in understanding the problem, alternatives and/or solutions.

4. Engagement approach

The project's impact level four Community and Stakeholder Engagement Plan was devised on a single stage approach to identify the level of community support for the proposal.

Conducted over a three-week period from 18 June 2021 to 12 July 2021, the engagement consisted of a series of activities that provided opportunities for community and stakeholders to contribute.

The engagement was planned, implemented and reported in accordance with Council's Community Engagement Matrix (2017).

A project page was established on our have your say platform with information provided in an accessible and easy to read format.



The project was primarily promoted through our regular email newsletter (EDM) channels.

Feedback was captured through an online comment form embedded onto the have your say project page. The form included a question that directly asked respondents for their level of support on the proposal.

An open-field comments box provided community members a space to explain or elaborate on their support, not support or neutral sentiment as well as any other feedback they wished to contribute.

Email and written comments were also invited.

We asked a uniform set of questions of participants in all activities. Results provide responses across a spectrum of demographics, expertise, experience and understanding of our local government area.

5. Findings

91 percent of respondents indicated they supported the proposal plus another three percent of respondents supported it with mostly minor changes.

Respondents supportive of the concept applauded Council's initiative for the proposed upgrade and highlighted that the project would improve the Club's facilities and have a positive impact on the growth of female participation in sport.

Those requesting changes indicated that they would like to see a gym, more terrace seating and another changeroom to accommodate home and away teams. Sustainability features and building access were also raised for Council's consideration.

Two percent of respondents had a neutral or undetermined position and the remaining four percent of respondents opposed the proposal.

Some respondents raised concerns about Council spending too much money on one field and would like to see other sports facilities upgraded. Other concerns were about the impact on the surrounding residential area of over development of the nature reserve. Some also requested an upgrade to parking and road signage.

The key themes and more detailed breakdown of what we heard are outlined in **Table 1**.

At this stage, we are unable to accommodate requests for incorporation of additional facilities.
Community benefit	Comments in support of the plan praised the proposed upgrade as being a great idea, not only improving the sports amenities to meet the needs of the reserve users, but also enhancing the reputation of northern beaches and Newport as a community that cares about the wellbeing, amenities and facilities available to its people.	We welcome the community support in this project initiative and will continue to deliver projects that benefit the community.
	A small number of comments raised the issue of spending too much on one field or having the area over-developed.	The proposed works are considered good value for the benefits expected.
Building design	Most respondents were supportive and commended the design of the new building and its appropriate fit with the existing building. Some others commented that it looked too engineered and suggested we consider some sustainability elements.	We acknowledge the design proposal is generally supported. However, we will consider further improvement, if appropriate, during the design development phase of the project.

During the exhibition period we received a number of questions either through direct contact or within feedback received.

Question / Feedback	Council's response
How many female Rugby players does the Newport Rugby Club have at the moment?	The proposal aims to deliver better-quality amenities to meet the continued growth of community sports participation, especially among women and girls. It also delivers a much-needed accessible toilet for people with a disability, as well as providing new facilities for the enjoyment of all players and spectators.



	The new amenities building will continue to support the 56 girls and 29 women currently playing in Newport Junior Rugby Club and Newport Rugby Club respectively; and the number of female players is expected to grow at a rate of 10 percent every year.
What is the approx. cost of this development?	The project is listed in Council's 2021/22 capital works program with a budget of \$800,000.
	It continues Council's commitment to support the community with improved sports amenities buildings including the ones recently built at Nolan Reserve, Lionel Watts Reserve and Balgowlah Oval.
What other proposals does Council have at the moment for development of female changing areas at other grounds across the Northern Beaches?	Northern Beaches Council also has plans in the 4-year program to improve facilities at Pittwater Rugby Park, with a particular emphasis on facilities for women and girls. I anticipate that it will require a similar level of funding to the previously mentioned facilities.
How does this proposal compare on a cost per player basis with other building projects to support female sports participation?"	The building at Lionel Watts Reserve cost around \$1.2m and the facility at Balgowlah Oval was around \$1m, so the costs are comparable with those proposed for Porters Reserve.

Such businesses as Aussielifts.com.au and Easy-living.com.au provide internal lift options. My suggestion is an improved plan is drafted that incorporates a mobility solution for all people, so that the clubhouse will become an accessible community asset to all."
