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## Community and Stakeholder Engagement Report

### Charge Ahead! EV Charging Locations (Stage 1 of 1)

**Idea Gathering Period:** 20 July to 3 August 2022

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## 1. Summary

This report outlines the outcomes of community and stakeholder engagement as part of a proposal to identify and provide more electric vehicle (EV) charging locations on the Northern Beaches.




This stage of engagement focused on gathering ideas from the community for additional charging locations. Idea gathering was undertaken between 20 July and 3 August both online and onsite at the NRMA Expo held in Ku-ring-gai between 23 and 24 July 2022.

The feedback collected during consultation indicated support for additional EV charging locations across the Northern Beaches. Supportive comments highlighted the anticipated benefits for all users, as well as the need to expand the network.


Locations provided on the map and in comments, were weighted toward tourist destinations, shopping centres, Council owned car parks, beaches and parks as the key locations to install EV charging on the Northern Beaches.

Respondents who were not supportive commented that we should not be seeking advice of EV charging locations from the community, it should be left to the professionals/technical assessments. Others commented on Council's involvement in providing access to public land for EV infrastructure.

### 1.3. Who responded

Demographic data was not requested or collected from the community at the NRMA Expo or online via the Social Pinpoint tool.

## 2. Background

Our Move – Northern Beaches Transport Strategy (2019) includes support for the introduction of new technologies and infrastructure for electric vehicles.

It is anticipated that electric vehicles will dominate the roads in 2038 and charging of these vehicles will mostly occur at home but charging facilities will also be needed for those living in apartment buildings which do not have access to charging facilities.

Community engagement sought to understand where the community would like to see more EV charging available. Our objective is to provide access to infrastructure, for on and off-street parking to support more fuel-efficient vehicles and electric vehicles.

Providing support for EV infrastructure will assist the implementation of electric vehicles in Australia, while supporting the tremendous change to our lifestyles. Providing additional EV charge locations will help to make clean transport the natural choice for our community.

## 3. Engagement objectives

Community and stakeholder engagement aimed to:

- engage with the community to find out where they thought we should put EV charging infrastructure that could be widely used by all
- identify community and stakeholder concerns, local knowledge and values
- seek out and facilitate the involvement of those affected by or interested in the project.

## 4. Engagement approach

Idea gathering for EV charging locations took place over a two week period between 20 July and 3 August.

Our Transport and Greener Communities teams took part in the NRMA Drive Days and Expo held on 24 and 25 July 2022 at Honda Australia Roadcraft Training (HART) in St Ives.

A project page was established on our have your say platform with information provided in an accessible and easy to read format.

Feedback was captured through an online interactive tool (Social Pinpoint) which allowed the community to drop a pin and (optional) comment on a location embedded onto the have your say project page.

An optional survey was available on the Social Pinpoint site to provide further information on community aspirations and demographics.

We invited participants at the Expo to drop a pin on the map showing us exactly where they thought we should implement a charger and why.

The engagement was planned, implemented and reported in accordance with Council's Community Engagement Matrix (2017).

The project was primarily promoted through our regular email newsletter (EDM) channels.

Email and written comments were also invited.

## 5. Findings

### 5.1 The map

The feedback collected during consultation indicated a high level of support for the proposed EV charging infrastructure across various locations in the Northern Beaches LGA.

Our community suggested various locations including Local Shops, Beaches, Council car parks and local parks being suitable locations for EV charging infrastructure. Many respondents provided multiple location recommendations.

Voting on a suggested location was enabled. The map allowed 'Up Votes' and 'Down Votes' with 18 locations receiving up votes. There were 205 up votes in total. Four locations received down votes. The total volume of down votes was 22.

For example, a suggested location with the comment 'Boat ramps, beaches, parks and harbour pools are perfect locations for chargers' received 38 up votes. 'Near Dee Why beach' received 16 down votes however it also received 11 up votes indicating that the suggested location has mixed support.

### 5.1 The Survey

The survey was completed by 11 participants. The survey respondents were both EV owners (55%) and non-EV owners (45%).

While survey response volumes were low compared to location ideas, the general indications of the responses provided showed the following:

- Respondents were mixed - both EV owners (55%) and non-owners (45%)
- Of the EV owners, most charging is done at home (71%)
- The key challenge to ownership of an EV was cited as 'not enough infrastructure' (86%)
- The key barrier facing EV owners was cited as 'knowing where charging stations are located' (71%)
- Knowledge of existing public EV charging locations in the Northern Beaches was roughly 50%.
